

O Almighty God, who hast knit together thine elect in one communion and fellowship in the mystical body of thy Son Christ our Lord: Grant us grace so to follow thy blessed saints in all virtuous and Godly living, that we may come to those ineffable joys which thou hast prepared for those who unfeignedly love thee; through the same Jesus Christ our Lord, who with thee and the Holy Spirit liveth and reigneth, one God, in glory everlasting.

And I saw another angel ascending from the east, having the seal of the living God: and he cried with a loud voice to the four angels, to whom it was given to hurt the earth and the sea, Saying, Hurt not the earth, neither the sea, nor the trees, till we have sealed the servants of our God in their foreheads. And I heard the number of them which were sealed: and there were sealed an hundred and forty and four thousand of all the tribes of the children of Israel. After this I beheld, and, lo, a great multitude, which no man could number, of all nations, and kindreds, and people, and tongues, stood before the throne, and before the Lamb, clothed with white robes, and palms in their hands; And cried with a loud voice, saying, Salvation to our God which sitteth upon the throne, and unto the Lamb. And all the angels stood round about the throne, and about the elders and the four beasts, and fell before the throne on their faces, and worshipped God, Saying, Amen: Blessing, and glory, and wisdom, and thanksgiving, and honour, and power, and might, be unto our God for ever and ever. Amen. And one of the elders answered, saying unto me, What are these which are arrayed in white robes? and whence came they? And I said unto him, Sir, thou knowest. And he said to me, These are they which came out of great tribulation, and have washed their robes, and

made them white in the blood of the Lamb. Therefore are they before the throne of God, and serve him day and night in his temple: and he that sitteth on the throne shall dwell among them. They shall hunger no more, neither thirst any more; neither shall the sun light on them, nor any heat. For the Lamb which is in the midst of the throne shall feed them, and shall lead them unto living fountains of waters: and God shall wipe away all tears from their eyes. *Response: Amen.*

While I have asked the Parish Council to organize our campaign this year (as our old Vestry did in the past) I wanted to preface it by reminding our parishioners and friends how important Pledging and Stewardship is for us this year. One might think that since we are meeting at St. Mary's (rather like like living in a luxury apartment house with all bills paid) we might not NEED to have such a successful campaign this year. **NOTHING CAN BE FURTHER FROM THE TRUTH!** The Catholic Church and the Ordinariate Authorities are depending on us to maintain our commitment to St. Timothy's on a level which does not just match that of 2010 and 2011 but EXCEEDS it. We have been able to meet all of our salaries and bills this year (though we are behind on the pension/retirement payments for your priest since last December) but we do need to start a BUILDING FUND for our eventual move out of the nest into our own home. One of the (significant) determinations for the timing of this (when we can realistically make plans to look for our own church) will be our 2012 Stewardship Campaign. Dear parishioners and "Friends" of St. Timothy's, when the Parish Council conducts our 2012 Drive next month, please be generous!
