

ANNOUNCEMENTS

- ❑ Our Parish Formation classes will continue today following the solemn mass. We have been granted an accelerated program so the classes are not much different in length than the inquirers classes we have all been through.
- ❑ St. Mary's celebrates Benediction of the Blessed Sacrament every Wednesday after the 7 p.m. Mass in the Church. Also, the Blessed Sacrament is exposed for Adoration every Thursday from 12:30 to 4:00 p.m. in the Chapel. Why not plan to visit our Saviour in the Most Holy Sacrament of the Altar sometime this Easter Season.
- ❑ The North Texas Catholic Men's Conference will be held on Saturday, April 28, at Prince of Peace Catholic Church in Plano. The registration fee is \$35 and covers conference attendance, handouts and lunch on the day of the event. Chris Shirley has offered as part of his Lenten and Easter charity this year, to give \$100 toward registration for our parish men and will provide transportation (3 comfortably; 4 a little cramped in Sheila's Explorer). - ❑ **Please Note:** For non profit tax reasons, our church will be temporarily under the 501c3 tax I.D. of St. Mary's Church, and they will set up a sub account for our offerings. Therefore, if you are pledging by check, PLEASE make the check out to ST. MARY'S CHURCH and put "St. Timothy's" in the memo line of the check. Please do NOT write "St. Timothy's" on the "pay to the order of" line, as it will have to be returned to you.
- ❑ Talking about money is perhaps the least attractive aspect of the job for a pastor, but talk about it we must. Since our move from 4201 Mitchell Blvd. to our new home on Magnolia Avenue, although attendance has remained steady, our collections are somewhat below what they should be. While our hosts at

St. Mary's underwrite the utility costs, we still have to pay salaries, pensions and other expenses which allow our congregation to flourish. Hitherto, two generous individual families have been underwriting the printing costs of bulletins and service music (as well as stipends for musicians for special occasions like Palm Sunday and Easter) but actually these expenses need to be borne by all of us. Also, we need to start saving some money to begin a building fund for our future. Therefore, we ask you to please be as generous as you can in supporting our church as well as considering helping with printing costs.

- ❑ If you were baptized or confirmed in another Episcopal Church, please call them for your records ASAP. If you encounter difficulty, please let me know and I will do what I can. The same applies if you were baptized in another protestant Church (Baptist, Lutheran, Methodist, etc.)

NOTE: If you CANNOT obtain your records, (church closed, records lost etc.) then, you can write out the attestation that you were baptized at such and such a date (with witnesses signatures attached if possible) and we will proceed accordingly. Please see Julia Smead if you need to write out such an attestation. Remember -- the goal is to get you INTO the Church, and I know that Monsignor Steenson, Bishop Vann, and the other Catholic Authorities will do all that they can to facilitate this.
