- ❑ The motor in the lovely organ at our host parish of St. Mary of the Assumption broke unexpectedly last Sunday. Father Bristow and the St. Mary's Organist are attempting to repair it as quickly as possible. In the meantime, we have decided to continue with our regular celebration of Solemn Mass, with our choir in the front of the church (in the first pews next to the pulpit) and with congregational singing. Father Stainbrook and St. Timothy's Organist, Tomi Godbee will be choosing familiar hymns for us to sing a cappella, but we need everyone's voice. Please plan to sing robustly this Sunday (remember, St. Augustine reminds us that singing is like saying a prayer, twice!).
- ❑ Christian Education continues today. Please make sure that your children are in their classrooms promptly -- snacks will be served to them there. See Sheila Shirley for details.
- ❑ The Saint Timothy's Parish Council will meet NEXT SUNDAY, April 28th, in the rectory conference room following the 2 p.m. mass. The agenda for this meeting will discuss and address revenue, attendance, future events and long term planning. Any parishioner who has an additional agenda item is encouraged to bring it to the attention of any member of the Parish Council (listed in this bulletin). - ❑ Altar Servers Needed: St. Timothy's utilizes 9 altar servers for every mass. The same nine men and boys have been serving without rest for almost a year now. We are inviting other male members of our congregation to assist them, so that we might develop a schedule which allows our regular servers to sit with their families some weeks. One of the signature hallmarks of St. Timothy's has always been our beautiful and traditional liturgy, and it would be a shame to have to reduce the number of servers at this time. - ❑ The Altar Guild is also in need of new blood! Several of our senior members have retired or moved this year. The work involved is minimal, but much appreciated by all members of our congregation. It consists of arriving a few minutes early on Sunday afternoon to set up for mass, and/or staying a few minutes after mass to clean up the vessels. Linens are taken home to be laundered and returned the following week. The Altar Guild consists of BOTH men AND women -- if you can help with this important ministry, please see Altar Guild Directress, Betsy Acker.

❑ Fr. Stainbrook will be hearing Confessions at 3 p.m. this Saturday, and will be celebrating and preaching at the Saturday 4:30 Mass at St. Mary's.

❑ Memo from Msgr. Stephen J. Berg: Assignment of Rev. Timothy Perkins.

"I am pleased to announce that in concurrence with the recommendation of Rev. Msgr. Jeffrey Steenson, Ordinary of the "Personal Ordinariate of the Chair of St. Peter", I have assigned Rev. Timothy Perkins as Parochial Administrator of St. Mary the Virgin Parish in Arlington, Texas, effective April 1, 2013. Fr. Perkins is replacing Rev. Joshua Whitfield. Msgr. Steenson informed the Diocese of Fort Worth that Fr. Whitfield is now assigned to the Diocese of Dallas, Texas. Please join me in thanking Fr. Whitfield for his service to the parishioners of St. Mary the Virgin parish. Also, let us continue to pray for Fr. Perkins' ministry in our Diocese as he assumes his new duties."

Title of Monsignor Bestowed Upon Rev. Joseph Pemberton

His Holiness Pope Benedict XVI appointed Rev. Joseph Pemberton to Chaplain to His Holiness, with title of Monsignor. This was one of the final acts that His Holiness approved before his retirement. The Holy Father has granted this honorary title to Fr. Pemberton, which was once reserved for Clerics who worked in the papal household or for the Roman Curia. Contemporary popes have bestowed this office as papal honor to clergy at the request of their bishops. Bishop Vann had requested this honor prior to his leaving our Diocese. Msgr. Pemberton will be honored at a ceremony the evening of Monday, May 6, 2013, at St. Patrick Cathedral. Solemn Vespers will begin at 7 p.m. This will be followed by a reception in the hall of St. Patrick's.
