One of the signature hallmarks of St. Timothy's has always been our beautiful and traditional liturgy, and it would be a shame to have to reduce the number of servers at this time. - ❑ The Altar Guild is also in need of new blood! Several of our senior members have retired or moved this year. The work involved is minimal, but much appreciated by all members of our congregation. It consists of arriving a few minutes early on Sunday afternoon to set up for mass, and/or staying a few minutes after mass to clean up the vessels. Linens are taken home to be laundered and returned the following week. The Altar Guild consists of BOTH men AND women -- if you can help with this important ministry, please see Altar Guild Directress, Betsy Acker.

- ❑ Memo from Msgr. Stephen J. Berg, Diocesan Administrator

Our hearts and prayers go out to the people of West, Texas and the surrounding areas as they deal with the devastation and suffering caused by the fertilizer plant explosion Wednesday night. We extend the support of the Diocese of Fort Worth to the people of West, and the Diocese of Austin, as they struggle through this devastation. I have spoken with Bishop Joseph Vasquez, Diocese of Austin, and he says that there is a great need at this time for financial assistance and for donations of blood for the victims. I ask that the people of the Diocese of Fort Worth respond generously to these needs, and that we take heart from the call of Pope Francis this morning, to “Please join me in praying for the victims of the explosion in Texas and their families.” Funds taken up for the West tragedy will be distributed through Catholic Charities of Central Texas in the Diocese of Austin, and to those in our parishes that sustained loss through this horrific event.
