

## *Sixth Sunday of Easter*

*1st Reading: Acts 8:5-8, 14-17*

And Saul was consenting to his death. And on that day a great persecution arose against the church in Jerusalem; and they were all scattered throughout the region of Judea and Samaria, except the apostles. Devout men buried Stephen, and made great lamentation over him. But Saul was ravaging the church, and entering house after house, he dragged off men and women and committed them to prison. Now those who were scattered went about preaching the word. Philip went down to a city of Samaria, and proclaimed to them the Christ. And the multitudes with one accord gave heed to what was said by Philip, when they heard him and saw the signs which he did. For unclean spirits came out of many who were possessed, crying with a loud voice; and many who were paralyzed or lame were healed. So there was much joy in that city. Now when the apostles at Jerusalem heard that Samaria had received the word of God, they sent to them Peter and John, who came down and prayed for them that they might receive the Holy Spirit; for it had not yet fallen on any of them, but they had only been baptized in the name of the Lord Jesus. Then they laid their hands on them and they received the Holy Spirit.

But in your hearts reverence Christ as Lord. Always be prepared to make a defense to anyone who calls you to account for the hope that is in you, yet do it with gentleness and reverence; and keep your conscience clear, so that, when you are abused, those who revile your good behavior in Christ may be put to shame. For it is better to suffer for doing right, if that should be God's will, than for doing wrong. For Christ also died for sins once for all, the righteous for the unrighteous, that he might bring us to God, being put to death in the flesh but made alive in the spirit. *Response: Thanks be to God.*

*The Gospel: John 14:15-21*

"If you love me, you will keep my commandments. And I will pray the Father, and he will give you another Counselor, to be with you for ever, even the Spirit of truth, whom the world cannot receive, because it neither sees him nor knows him; you know him, for he dwells with you, and will be in you. "I will not leave you desolate; I will come to you. Yet a little while, and the world will see me no more, but you will see me; because I live, you will live also. In that day you will know that I am in my Father, and you in me, and I in you. He who has my commandments and keeps them, he it is who loves me; and he who loves me will be loved by my Father, and I will love him and manifest myself to him."

## Announcements

- ◇ St. Timothy's Parishioners and Friends of St. Timothy's are urged to take a moment to recall why it is we have a Special Day on Monday, and say a prayer for the fallen. We are all blessed to live in the Land of the Free --Because of the Actions of the Brave.
- ◇ Solemnity of the Ascension of the Lord (June 1, 2014). In the Diocese of Fort Worth, as in most Catholic dioceses in the United States, the Solemnity of the Ascension is celebrated on the 7th Sunday of Easter. Saturday evening Masses, May 31, should use the Vigil Mass for the Solemnity of the Ascension of the Lord. At both the Vigil Mass and the Mass of the day, when the Roman Canon (Eucharistic Prayer 1) is used the proper form of the Communicants is said. A Solemn Blessing for the Ascension may be found with other Solemn Blessings in the Missal. On Thursday, May 29, the Mass for Thursday of the 6th week of Easter is used.
- ◇ Our next Potluck will be Sunday, June 1st following the 2 pm Mass. This is also Carl and Suzanne McNeil's 50th Wedding Anniversary, and they will be providing dessert for the Potluck on that day. Everyone else is encouraged to bring regular food as usual (or a special dessert if needed - gluten/sugar free, etc.) Please plan to attend our June Potluck, and not only enjoy food, fun and fellowship with each other, but also celebrate Carl and Suzanne's special day!
- ◇ Severe floods have hit Croatia, Serbia and the Balkins this week, affecting friends close to home. Several villages have declared emergency situations following floods across Croatia. The Mura, Sava, Sutla, Kupa and Lonja rivers have all flooded with Sava, which runs through Zagreb, rising to 15 feet near the capital, the highest it has been in the last 50 years. What does this mean for us at St. Timothy's? The hardworking custodian at our host parish of St. Mary's, Zoran Radan, (whom many of our people have met) has told us that his father's home (the home where he grew up) has been completely destroyed by the floods. Croatia does not offer Flood Insurance, so the Radan family (along with thousands of others) have lost everything. St. Mary's is taking up a special collection this Sunday and next week to help the people of Zoran's village. St. Timothy's parishioners are invited to participate in this assistance. To contribute, one can put a check made out to "St. Mary of the Assumption" in the collection basket (please write "Flood Assistance" or "Zoran" in the memo section of the check), or one can bring a contribution to the business office at the church during the week. The money will

be sent to the local parish church for distribution to those in need. Thank you and God bless you!

- ◇ Also, despite the recent rains in the DFW areas, parts of the Diocese and particularly the Wichita Falls areas are in severe drought conditions. The Diocese asks that parishes offer prayers for rain during the Prayers of the Faithful.
