Our website was extensively revised when we became St. Timothy's Catholic Church. Feel free to drop by anytime (<http://www.sttimothyfortworth.org/>). There, you will find the latest information about St. Timothy's. For example, an archive of weekly bulletins is maintained beginning January 1, 2012 through the present. The bulletins are in .pdf format and are in color.

On January 25, 2013 analytical software was applied to our website to track visits. The software is for analysis only and does not collect private information. To date, we have had 1,334 visits (814 unique visitors) from 16 countries. Those countries are USA, Poland, Canada, France, Italy (probably the Pope), UK, Germany, Guatemala, Israel, Brazil, Australia, Philippines, Singapore, Egypt, and India.
