Easter 4 ~ Year B


1st Reading: Acts 4:8-12

The Gospel: John 10:11-18

I am the good shepherd. The good shepherd lays down his life for the sheep. He who is a hireling and not a shepherd, whose own the sheep are not, sees the wolf coming and leaves the sheep and flees; and the wolf snatches them and scatters them. He flees because he is a hireling and cares nothing for the sheep. I am the good shepherd; I know my own and my own know me, as the Father knows me and I know the Father; and I lay down my life for the sheep. And I have other sheep, that are not of this fold; I must bring them also, and they will heed my voice. So there shall be one flock, one shepherd. For this reason the Father loves me, because I lay down my life, that I may take it again. No one takes it from me, but I lay it down of my own accord. I have power to lay it down, and I have power to take it again; this charge I have received from my Father.”

Announcements

- ❑ The May Parish Potluck will be the 1st Sunday of the month, May 3rd, following the 2 p.m. Solemn Mass, Mark your calendars now and plan to enjoy food and fellowship with your friends at St. Timothy's on May 3rd. Father Stainbrook and Parish Council President, Carl McNiell have both expressed concern regarding the unexpectedly lower numbers at the April Pot Luck last week. These Pot Luck lunches are intended to be enjoyable occasions for fellowship and socializing, but if they are onerous to prepare for, or no longer enjoyable to attend, please let any member of the Parish Council know.
- ❑ Today is Good Shepherd Sunday and is the Fourth Sunday of Easter in the Catholic liturgical calendar; that is, the Sunday three weeks after Easter Sunday. The name derives from the Gospel readings on this day, which are taken from the 10th chapter of John. In this reading Christ is described as the Good Shepherd who, by dying on the Cross, lays down his life for his sheep.
- ❑ In recent times this feast day has also become known as Vocations Sunday; a day on which prayers should be said for vocations to the priesthood and religious life. There are currently 30 seminarians from 18 parishes of the Diocese of Fort Worth studying in seven seminaries throughout the United States and in Rome. The Diocese provides education and formation for each seminarian at an annual average cost of \$52,709. The "Good Shepherd Sunday Special Collection" assists with funding this annual cost -- if you would like to help, donations are being accepted online at the Diocesan Website.



And, speaking of Vocations: Many of us remember Fr. Jim Carlyle's portrait on our "Wall of (Episcopalian) Priests" which hung in the parish hall of our old (Mitchell Blvd,) campus. (His was the one with the stunning patriarchal beard!) Though now geographically separated from us at St. Timothy's, Father Carlyle (like us) joined the Catholic Church, and has recently been ordained a Catholic priest in Kansas City -- Congratulations and best wishes for a holy, healthy and happy priesthood!
