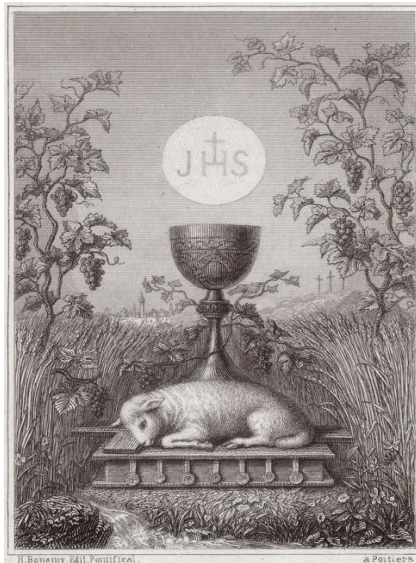
The Epistle: 1 Corinthians 1:1-3

Paul, called to be an apostle of Christ Jesus by the will of God, and Sosthenes our brother, to the Church of God that is in Corinth, to you who have been sanctified in Christ Jesus, called to be holy, with all those everywhere who call upon the name of our Lord Jesus Christ, their Lord and ours. Grace to you, and peace, from God our Father and the Lord Jesus Christ. *Response: Thanks be to God.*

The Gospel: (stand) John 1:29-34

John the Baptist saw Jesus coming toward him and said, “Behold, the Lamb of God, who takes away the sin of the world. He is the one of whom I said, ‘A man is coming after me who ranks ahead of me because he existed before me.’ I did not know him, but the reason why I came baptizing with water was that he might be made known to Israel.” John testified further, saying, “I saw the Spirit come down like a dove from heaven and remain upon him. I did not know him, but the one who sent me to baptize with water told me, ‘On whomever you see the Spirit come down and remain, he is the one who will baptize with the Holy Spirit.’ Now I have seen and testified that he is the Son of God.”

- ❑ Following today's mass the Saint Timothy's Parish Council will have a meeting in the rectory conference room.
- ❑ We are now in the third Church Season, that of Epiphany, which lasts until the beginning of Lent on Ash Wednesday, March 5th. (You might remember that on the Feast of the Epiphany, we read the Proclamation of the Date of Easter after the Homily, which lists the liturgical observances in the Catholic Church for 2014) In the season of Epiphany, we think upon the different Scriptural manifestations of the Divinity of Jesus that pours forth from His Incarnate life as the Son of God, the Word become Flesh (Who dwells among Us). The Gospel stories of Epiphany-tide are powerful and riveting, as we are confronted with a multitude of evidence of whom Jesus is.
- ❑ The Mass of ordination and installation of Bishop-elect Michael F. Olson will be held at 2 p.m., Wednesday, January 29, 2014 in the Fort Worth Convention Center Arena, 1200 Houston Street.
