- ❑ All Parish Meeting Scheduled for February 10th - Quinquagesima Sunday. Please mark your calendars and plan to attend an ALL PARISH MEETING on Sunday, February 10th, after the 2 p.m. Solemn Mass. This is the Sunday immediately following the important Symposium about the Mission of the Ordinariate taking place February 2nd and 3rd in Houston. (which is why we have scheduled our "annual Meeting" for February rather than January). At this meeting the 2013 Budget will be presented and the members of the Parish Council will be announced. This Meeting will also be a time for us to discuss and visualize where our future (both short term and long term) might lead us. A Building Committee and a Capital Campaign will be considered. St. Timothy's Guilds and Groups (Youth Group, Knights of Columbus, Altar Guild, etc.) will make reports and there will be other items of interest. EVERYONE is encouraged to attend this meeting!
- ❑ Wednesday, February 13th, is ASH WEDNESDAY. There will be a St. Timothy's Anglican Use Mass in the Church at 9:30 a.m. (with Ashes) and Father Stainbrook will be assisting at the St. Mary's Masses at Noon and 7 p.m. (also with Ashes). While we hope that as many as possible will attend our Ordinariate Anglican Use Service in the morning, please remember that St. Timothy's parishioners are always welcome to attend any Masses and Special Services at St. Mary's as well.
- ❑ The Friday after Ash Wednesday, February 15th, begins our 2013 series of Stations of the Cross in St Mary's Church at 7 p.m. The Parish Council will be discussing the feasibility of a having a Meatless Meal in the Cafeteria before the service. (The logistics of this will have to be most carefully worked out). Another possibility is for our parishioners to gather at a restaurant, and enjoy a meal together, before arriving at St. Mary's for the Service. In any event, we hope that ALL of our Parishioners will keep the habit of attending Stations this year as we have since the founding of our congregation. Please do not let the fact that our Services are not EXACTLY like the use to be at our former location (for the time being) keep you from participating in this most Spiritually Enriching practice.
- ❑ We are tabulating the response to our STEWARDSHIP CAMPAIGN for this year. Unfortunately, we have not yet met our goals to meet expected expenses for 2013, much

less plan for our future. How we at St. Timothy's move forward in 2013 is largely dependent on the response we receive from our Campaign. If you have not yet made a pledge for next year, please contact treasurer Carol Christian to do so. Our of area "Friends" of St. Timothy's are encouraged to contact Carol as well.

- ❑ **NEW PRIEST FOR THE ORDINARIATE:** Our prayers and best wishes are extended to our old friend, Fr. John Cornelius, who was ordained a priest in the Catholic Church on January 26th. It's been a long road Father John, and we're very proud of you!
- ❑ The Diocese of Fort Worth has sent out a directive regarding the distribution of Holy Communion. Due to the increasing reports of flu symptoms and respiratory infections of people in the Diocese of Fort Worth at this time, they have determined that: the practice of distributing Holy Communion at Holy Mass be absolutely maintained with the distribution of the Holy Body of Christ at Mass, and to temporarily suspend the distribution of the Holy Blood of Christ to the Faithful for this time." (Quoting their Directive to All Priests)

We therefore urge that ANY parishioner who is experiencing cold or flu symptoms to refrain from partaking from the Chalice. It is strongly emphasized that the full benefit of the Sacrament, that is, the entire Body, Blood, Soul and Divinity of Our Lord, is present in either species (bread or wine) and the full efficacy of Holy Communion is always given when one partakes solely of the Host.

If there is ANY concern about germs, it is ALWAYS acceptable (and indeed encouraged) to receive in One Kind only. Indeed, it has been Catholic practice for centuries to receive only the Host, and it is a laudable and honorable custom so to do, regardless of the health concerns mentioned in this Directive.

We were reminded last week, and we pass it along to all our congregants, that the practice of INTINCTION ( that is, the dipping of the Host into the Chalice by either the recipient of the Eucharistic Minister (Subdeacon) ) is forbidden at all times, because it is far easier to spread germs via the hands than by mouth.
