

Announcements

- ◆ Creating a safe environment for children and young people is a diocesan priority for Fort Worth. The Ordinariate has also stressed that creating a safe environment for our people is our priority as well. Article 12 of the US Bishops' document, The Charter for the Protection of Children and Young People, requires U.S. dioceses to establish "safe environment programs" and gives the necessary elements of these programs. The diocesan safe environment program includes:
 - Training for all volunteers regarding the dynamics of abuse and abuse-prevention strategies (this is required every 3 years).
 - Evaluation of the backgrounds of all employees and volunteers.
 - Review and signing of the Code of Conduct and Standards of Behavior.

All programs require the presence of two adults or one adult and two older teen. This policy extends to:

- All Church-sponsored trainings and events regardless of where the programs or activities are held.
- Catholic school events and activities outside of a regular classroom setting
- Religious education classes and programs
- Youth ministry programs and events
- Liturgy of the Word for children
- Rite of Christian Initiation adapted for children
- Babysitting, nursery and child care programs
- Choirs for children and youth
- Altar server training
- Vacation Bible School
- Scouting.

All employees are screened during the interview and hiring process. All new volunteers are to be interviewed and screened. Debbie Alavarez, the Business manager at St. Mary's, is qualified to conduct Safe Environment Training Sessions. It is very important that St. Timothy's take these sessions seriously, and that as many of our people as possible attend them. Our Parish Safe Environment Program will be conducted by Debbie SUNDAY. MARCH 2nd (QUINQUAGESIMA SUNDAY) after the 2 p.m. Mass. The meeting will coincide with our monthly Potluck Lunch; however the meal will be catered by the Diocese - No need to bring any food on that day.

- ❑ A NOTE FROM OUR TREASURER: The cold and wet weather last week (February 2nd), kept many of our parishioners from attending our 2 p.m. Sunday Mass. - ❑ Diocese of Fort Worth World Day of the Sick ~ February 11, 2014. In observance of World Day of the Sick, Bishop Michael F. Olson will celebrate Mass with the Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick at St. Patrick Cathedral at 6:30 pm. All are invited to come and pray for those who are in need of healing and for those who care for the sick and dying.

About World Day of the Sick

Father Stainbrook assists the Diocese as an On Call Chaplain for the Hospital District of Fort Worth, and will be on the altar at this Mass. All are welcome to join him and the new Bishop of Fort Worth at this special celebration. Parishioners who are ill are especially encouraged to receive anointing from Fort Worth's new Chief Shepherd during this special celebration

Pope John Paul II initiated the day in 1992 to encourage people to pray for those who suffer from illness and for their caregivers. The Pope himself had been diagnosed with Parkinson's a year before, in 1991, and it is considered that his own illness was impetus for his designation of the day.

As a reminder, St. Timothy's is a fully Roman Catholic Congregation, and that receiving communion at this mass satisfies the obligation for all Catholics. Please refer to the "Guidelines for receiving Holy Communion" on page 31 of the mass booklet.

Old Testament Reading: Isaiah 58:7-10


Thus says the LORD: Share your bread with the hungry, shelter the oppressed and the homeless; clothe the naked when you see them, and do not turn your back on your own. Then your light shall break forth like the dawn, and your wound shall quickly be healed; your vindication shall go before you, and the glory of the LORD shall be your rear guard. Then you shall call, and the LORD will answer, you shall cry for help, and he will say: Here I am! If you remove from your midst oppression, false accusation and malicious speech; if you bestow your bread on the hungry and satisfy the afflicted; then light shall rise for you in the darkness, and the gloom shall become for you like midday.

The Epistle: 1 Corinthians 2:1-5

When I came to you, brothers and sisters, proclaiming the mystery of God, I did not come with sublimity of words or of wisdom. For I resolved to know nothing while I was with you except Jesus Christ, and him crucified. I came to you in weakness and fear and much trembling, and my message and my proclamation were not with persuasive words of wisdom, but with a demonstration of Spirit and power, so that your faith might rest not on human wisdom but on the power of God. *Response: Thanks be to God.*

The Gospel: (stand) Matthew 5:13-16

Jesus said to his disciples: “You are the salt of the earth. But if salt loses its taste, with what can it be seasoned? It is no longer good for anything but to be thrown out and trampled underfoot. You are the light of the world. A city set on a mountain cannot be hidden. Nor do they light a lamp and then put it under a bushel basket; it is set on a lampstand, where it gives light to all in the house. Just so, your light must shine before others, that they may see your good deeds and glorify your heavenly Father.”
