

The Epistle: 1 Corinthians 3:16-23

Brothers and sisters: Do you not know that you are the temple of God, and that the Spirit of God dwells in you? If anyone destroys God's temple, God will destroy that person; for the temple of God, which you are, is holy. Let no one deceive himself. If any one among you considers himself wise in this age, let him become a fool, so as to become wise. For the wisdom of this world is foolishness in the eyes of God, for it is written: God catches the wise in their own ruses, and again: The Lord knows the thoughts of the wise, that they are vain. So let no one boast about human beings, for everything belongs to you, Paul or Apollos or Cephas, or the world or life or death, or the present or the future: all belong to you, and you to Christ, and Christ to God. *Response: Thanks be to God.*

The Gospel: (stand) Matthew 5:38-48

Jesus said to his disciples: "You have heard that it was said, An eye for an eye and a tooth for a tooth. But I say to you, offer no resistance to one who is evil. When someone strikes you on your right cheek, turn the other one as well. If anyone wants to go to law with you over your tunic, hand over your cloak as well. Should anyone press you into service for one mile, go for two miles. Give to the one who asks of you, and do not turn your back on one who wants to borrow. "You have heard that it was said, You shall love your neighbor and hate your enemy. But I say to you, love your enemies and pray for those who persecute you, that you may be children of your heavenly Father, for he makes his sun rise on the bad and the good, and causes rain to fall on the just and the unjust. For if you love those who love you, what recompense will you have? Do not the tax collectors do the same? And if you greet your brothers only, what is unusual about that? Do not the pagans do the same? So be perfect, just as your heavenly Father is perfect." *Response: Praise be to Thee O Christ*

As a reminder, St. Timothy's is a fully Roman Catholic Congregation, and that receiving communion at this mass satisfies the obligation for all Catholics. Please refer to the "Guidelines for receiving Holy Communion" on page 31 of the mass booklet.

Announcements

- ❑ Creating a safe environment for children and young people is a diocesan priority for Fort Worth. The Ordinariate has also stressed that creating a safe environment for our people is our priority as well. Article 12 of the US Bishops' document, The Charter for the Protection of Children and Young People, requires U.S. dioceses to establish "safe environment programs" and gives the necessary elements of these programs. Debbie Alavarez, the Business manager at Saint Mary's, is qualified to conduct Safe Environment Training Sessions. It is very important that St. Timothy's take these sessions seriously, and that as many of our people as possible attend them. Our Parish Safe Environment Program will be conducted by Debbie next SUNDAY. MARCH 2nd (QUINQUAGESIMA SUNDAY) after the 2 p.m. Mass. The meeting will coincide with our monthly Potluck Lunch; however the meal will be catered by the Diocese - No need to bring any food on that day.
- ❑ **Ash Wednesday** is March 5th. Our St. Timothy's Mass will be at 9:30 a.m. St. Mary's masses will be Noon and 6 p.m. (English) and 8 p.m. Spanish.
- ❑ As we approach our annual Lenten season, please keep the following in mind:
 - Fast and Abstinence*
 - All persons who have reached their 14th birthday are bound by the law of abstinence. All adults are bound by the law of fast up to their 60th year. The current canonical discipline of penance for the United States, in addition to the general character of the Lenten season, may thus be summed up: Ash Wednesday and Good Friday are days of abstinence from meat and also days of fast; that is, limited to a single full meal. The other Fridays of Lent remain days of abstinence from meat. The Fridays of the year outside Lent remain days of penance, but each individual may substitute for the traditional abstinence from meat some other practice of voluntary self-denial or personal penance; this may be physical mortification or temperance or acts of religion, charity, or Christian witness.
 - Chrism Mass:* Tuesday, April 15 at 5:30 pm at St. Patrick Cathedral.
 - Easter Vigil:* The earliest time the Easter Vigil should be scheduled is 8:30 pm.
- ❑ Speaking of St. John Vianney Catholic Church, their Parish Council President shared an innovative fund raising tip with the congregation last week. Each night, instead of putting the changes in your pocket on a dresser, why not put it in a jar for the church? Those quarters, dimes, nickels and even pennies add up over time, and

can really benefit St. Timothy's. The Council President at St. John Vianney started doing this in Advent and now, just eight or so weeks later, has saved \$60 in change for his church. If all our St. Timothy's people did this as well, it would be very helpful for us -- why not consider placing a jar on your dresser or kitchen table too? It's a small gesture, but indeed, a "little change can do us all some good"! St. Timothy's thanks you for your support!
