

## *First Sunday in Lent*


*Old Testament Reading: Genesis 2:7-9; 3:1-7*

The LORD God formed man out of the clay of the ground and blew into his nostrils the breath of life, and so man became a living being. Then the LORD God planted a garden in Eden, in the east, and placed there the man whom he had formed. Out of the ground the LORD God made various trees grow that were delightful to look at and good for food, with the tree of life in the middle of the garden and the tree of the knowledge of good and evil. Now the serpent was the most cunning of all the animals that the LORD God had made. The serpent asked the woman, “Did God really tell you not to eat from any of the trees in the garden?” The woman answered the serpent: “We may eat of the fruit of the trees in the garden; it is only about the fruit of the tree in the middle of the garden that God said, ‘You shall not eat it or even touch it, lest you die.’” But the serpent said to the woman: “You certainly will not die! No, God knows well that the moment you eat of it your eyes will be opened and you will be like gods who know what is good and what is evil.” The woman saw that the tree was good for food, pleasing to the eyes, and desirable for gaining wisdom. So she took some of its fruit and ate it; and she also gave some to her husband, who was with her, and he ate it. Then the eyes of both of them were opened, and they realized that they were naked; so they sewed fig leaves together and made loincloths for themselves. *Response: Thanks be to God.*

*The Epistle: Romans 5:12, 17-19*

Brothers and sisters: Through one man sin entered the world, and through sin, death, and thus death came to all men, inasmuch as all sinned. For if, by the transgression of the one, death came to reign through that one, how much more will those who receive the abundance of grace and of the gift of justification come to reign in life through the one Jesus Christ. In conclusion, just as through one transgression condemnation came upon all, so, through one righteous act, acquittal and life came to all. For just as through the disobedience of the one man the many were made sinners, so, through the obedience of the one, the many will be made righteous. *Response: Thanks be to God.*

*The Gospel: (stand) Matthew 4:1-11*

At that time Jesus was led by the Spirit into the desert to be tempted by the devil. He fasted for forty days and forty nights, and afterwards he was hungry. The tempter approached and said to him, “If you are the Son of God, command that these stones become loaves of bread.” He said in reply, “It is written: One does not live on bread alone, but on every word that comes forth from the mouth of God.” *Response: Praise be to Thee O Christ*

## Announcements

- ❑ Don't forget Stations of the Cross will be Fridays in Lent at 7 p.m. Father Bristow and Father Stainbrook will alternate in the leading of the Stations and hearing Confessions. Father Bristow will be doing both this Friday, and Father Stainbrook will be doing both next Friday, etc. -- We hope to have a good turnout of St. Timothy's Parishioners at these joint St. Timothy's/St. Mary's Services.
- ❑ There will also be expanded opportunities for Confessions during Lent - Confessions will be held on Fridays at 5:30 p.m. - 6:30 p.m. (before Stations of the Cross) and on Saturdays at 3:00 p.m. - 4:00 p.m. before the 4:30 Vigil Mass (St. Mary's Novus Ordo style).
- ❑ During this Lenten season, please keep the following in mind:

### *Fast and Abstinence*

All persons who have reached their 14th birthday are bound by the law of abstinence. All adults are bound by the law of fast up to their 60th year. The current canonical discipline of penance for the United States, in addition to the general character of the Lenten season, may thus be summed up: Ash Wednesday and Good Friday are days of abstinence from meat and also days of fast; that is, limited to a single full meal. The other Fridays of Lent remain days of abstinence from meat. The Fridays of the year outside Lent remain days of penance, but each individual may substitute for the traditional abstinence from meat some other practice of voluntary self-denial or personal penance; this may be physical mortification or temperance or acts of religion, charity, or Christian witness.

*Chrism Mass:* Tuesday, April 15 at 5:30 pm at St. Patrick Cathedral.

*Easter Vigil:* The earliest time the Easter Vigil should be scheduled is 8:30 pm.

- ❑ A Note From Our Treasurer: The Icy/Sleety/ Hazardous Weather prevented many parishioners from journeying to Mass last Sunday (March 2nd). Our attendance (and collections) were both very low last week. - ❑ The St. John Vianney Parish Council President shared an innovative fund raising tip with the congregation last week. Each night, instead of putting the changes in your pocket on a dresser, why not put it in a jar for the church? Those quarters, dimes, nickels and even pennies add up over time, and can really benefit St. Timothy's. The Council President at St. John Vianney started doing this in Advent and now, just eight or so weeks later, has saved \$60 in change for his church.
