

And Jesus answered him, "It is written, 'Man shall not live by bread alone.'" "And the devil took him up, and showed all the

kingdoms of the world in a moment of time, and said to him, “To you I will give all this authority and their glory; for it has been delivered to me, and I give it to whom I will. Guidelines for Receiving Communion For Catholics. Our celebration today is a fully valid Catholic Mass. All Roman Catholics at this mass are permitted to receive Holy Communion if properly disposed. In order to be properly disposed to receive Communion, participants should not be conscious of grave sin and normally should have fasted for one hour. A person who is conscious of grave sin is not to receive the Body and Blood of our Lord without prior sacramental confession, except for a grave reason where there is no opportunity for confession. In this case, the person is to be mindful of the obligation to make a perfect act of contrition, including the intention of confessing as soon as possible (Canon 916). A frequent reception of the sacrament of penance is encouraged for all.

Guidelines for our fellow Christians. We welcome our fellow Christians to this celebration of the Eucharist as our brothers and sisters. We pray that our common baptism and the action of the Holy Spirit in the Eucharist will draw us closer to one another and begin to dispel the sad divisions which separate us. We pray that these will lessen and finally disappear, in keeping with Christ's prayer for us "that they may all be one" (John 17:21). Because Catholics believe that the celebration of the Eucharist is a sign of the reality of the oneness of faith, life, and worship, members of those churches with whom we are not yet fully united are ordinarily not admitted to Holy Communion. You are invited to proceed to the altar for a blessing if you wish.

ANNOUNCEMENTS

- ❑ Friday Night Stations of the Cross began last Friday and will continue throughout Lent. We hope that EVERYONE at St. Timothy's will make EVERY effort to attend Stations at St. Mary's, just as we did in our former location on Mitchell Blvd, and keep this import Spiritual Discipline alive as part of our heritage, just as we did for 50+ years as Episcopalians. This year we will be using the familiar and beloved edition of the Stations of the Cross from the ST. AUGUSTINE PRAYER BOOK. St. Timothy's Servers will be assisting every other week. Don't let the fact that everything is not EXACTLY the same as it was when we were Episcopal (while the Stations are identical to what we've always had, there is no meatless meal and no speaker) keep us from practicing our Lenten traditions. Remember that BENEDICTION OF THE BLESSED SACRAMENT is celebrated every WEDNESDAY after the 7 p.m. Mass at St. Mary's Church.
- ❑ It's not too late to make your Lenten rule. Copies of "Making Your Lenten Rule are available from the ushers and on St. Timothy's website as well.
- ❑ Confession times during Lent are as follows: Saturday -3:00PM and Friday – 6:00PM. Make yours early; by parochial custom, there are NO confessions at St. Mary's during HOLY WEEK.
- ❑ Many thanks to Chris Christian for initiating a Facebook page for St. Timothy's. Facebook is a free internet-based social networking service launched in February 2004 and is the world's most popular social networking website. It makes it easy for you to connect and share with your family and friends online.
- ❑ We are reminded that the practice of INTINCTION (that is, the dipping of the Host into the Chalice by either the recipient of the Eucharistic Minister (Subdeacon)) is forbidden at all times, because it is far easier to spread germs via the hands than by mouth.
