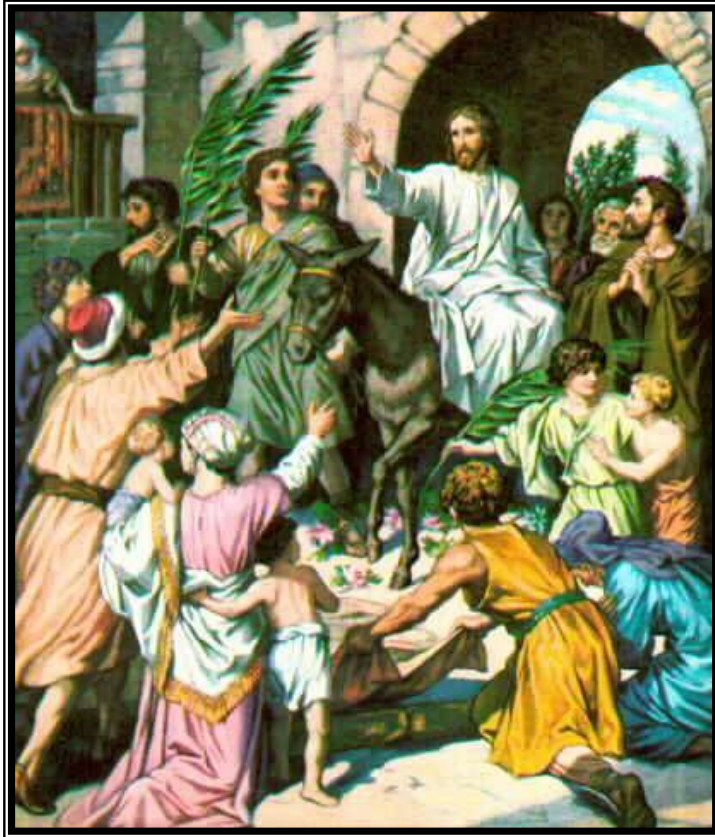

## *Palm Sunday*

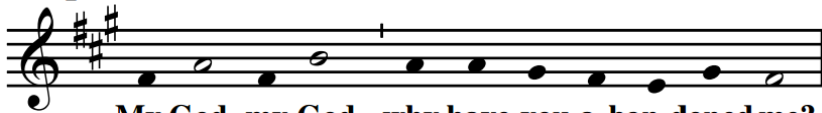
*Old Testament Reading: Isaiah 50:4-7*

I gave my back to those who beat me, my cheeks to those who plucked my beard; my face I did not shield from buffets and spitting. Christ Jesus, though he was in the form of God, did not regard equality with God something to be grasped. Rather, he emptied himself, taking the form of a slave, coming in human likeness; and found human in appearance, he humbled himself, becoming obedient to the point of death, even death on a cross.
