We have been using Father Stainbrook's personal vestments on Sunday Mornings. Recently we have learned about this beautiful new vestment set for sale. This GREEN set consists of :

1 Roman Chasuble Set - Roman Chasuble, Stole, Maniple, Burse & Chalice Veil

1 Dalmatic Set - Dalmatic, Deacon Stole & Maniple

1 Tunicle Set - Tunicle & Maniple

1 Roman Cope Set - Cope, Humeral Veil & Stole.

Material: Church Brocade with Cross design and the orphreys are made of Silk Fabric with hand embroidery, lined with Satin Fabric.

Description: All the designs are made of Metallic Gold and Metallic Silver thread. This Chasuble comes with the cords attached. The complete set is made with a mix of Damask and Silk Fabric as the pictures shown below. The entire set will cost \$1500 plus shipping (a bargain for the over twenty hand embroidered pieces in this set). Since we also were forced to turn over all the money in our checking account and other accounts to the ACNA rump group, there are no funds available to purchase this much needed set.
