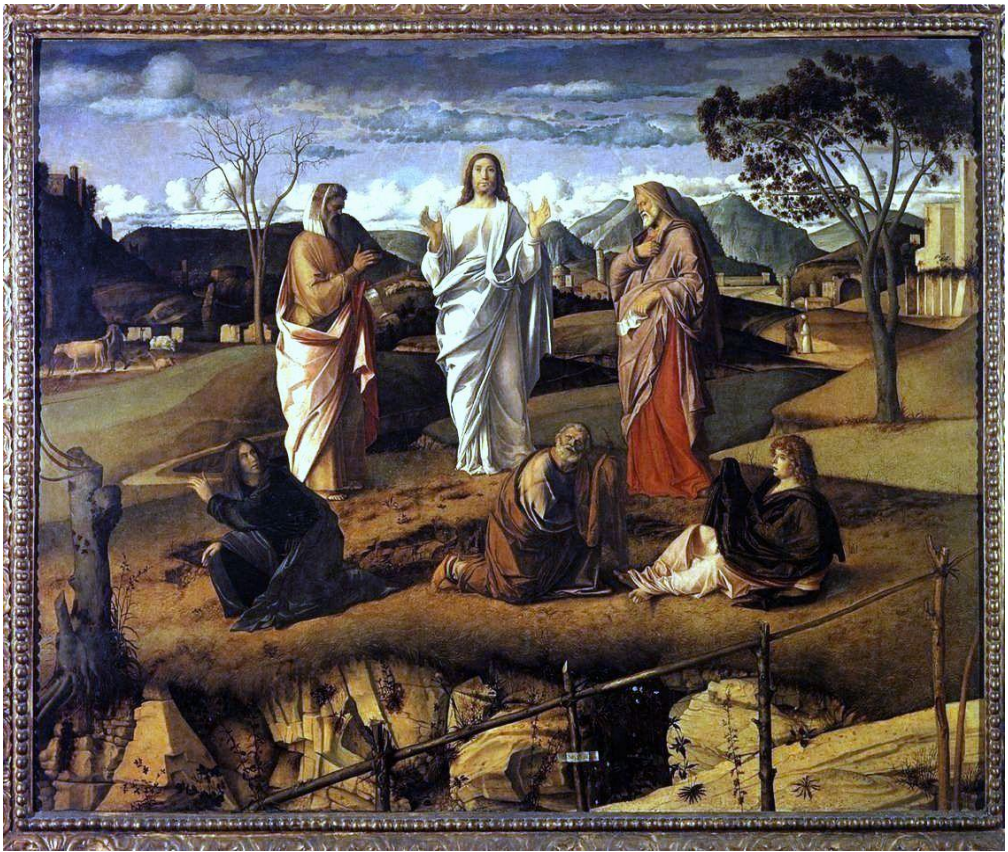

- ❑ October is "Ministry Month at St. Timothy's and next month is STEWARDSHIP month. While I have asked the Parish Council to organize our campaign this year (as our old Vestry did in the past) I wanted to preface it by reminding our parishioners and friends how important Pledging and Stewardship is for us this year. One might think that since we are meeting at St. Mary's (rather like like living in a luxury apartment house with all bills paid) we might not NEED to have such a successful campaign this year. **NOTHING CAN BE FURTHER FROM THE TRUTH!** The Catholic Church and the Ordinariate Authorities are depending on us to maintain our commitment to St. Timothy's on a level which does not just match that of 2010 and 2011 but EXCEEDS it. We have been able to meet all of our salaries and bills this year (though we are behind on the

pension/retirement payments for your priest since last December) but we do need to start a BUILDING FUND for our eventual move out of the nest into our own home. One of the (significant) determinations for the timing of this (when we can realistically make plans to look for our own church) will be our 2012 Stewardship Campaign. Dear parishioners and "Friends" of St. Timothy's, when the Parish Council conducts our 2012 Drive next month, please be generous!
