

ANNOUNCEMENTS

- ❑ Our annual “Trunk or Treat” event is **today**. This popular event ensures that our kids receive "treats" which are nutritious and safe from their parish family. Children (of all ages) are encouraged to wear their costumes at Mass (if the costume is too out of keeping with Catholic Sunday Worship, please have your child change into it after mass. We will gather in the parking lot following the 2 p.m. Solemn Mass, open our car trunks and the kids will come around to each car to Trunk or Treat. Prizes will be given for Best Trunk and Best Costume. There will be a "pot luck" type of reception for our children and their families following the Trunk or Treat.
- ❑ The **ANNUAL ALL SOULS REQUIEM** will be held at St. Mary's Church next **FRIDAY** November 2nd, All Souls Day at **7 p.m.** Lists for the Beloved Departed to be read at the altar are available in the Narthex. This will be our first evening Mass together as a community since joining the Catholic Church. Attendance at this Mass will serve as a bellwether for planning future evening Masses. **IN OTHER WORDS: PLEASE MAKE EVERY ATTEMPT TO ATTEND THE REQUIEM MASS** -- not only to pray for our Beloved Departed, but to show by our presence at these special services that there is indeed great **INTEREST and ENTHUSIASM** for maintaining our historic St. Timothy's traditions.
- ❑ Daylight Saving Time ends next Sunday, November 4th. Remember to turn your clocks **BACK** one hour before retiring on Saturday evening.
- ❑ All Saints' Day is a holy day. There will be three Masses on November 1st -- a 9:30 a.m. St. Timothy's type Low Mass in the Chapel, and St. Mary's type Masses at Noon and at 7 p.m. in the Church (to which St. Timothy's parishioners are welcome to attend) All Saints' Sunday this year falls on November 4th, and will be celebrated at our regular Mass at 2 p.m.

October is "Ministry Month at St. Timothy's and next month is STEWARDSHIP month. While I have asked the Parish Council to organize our campaign this year (as our old Vestry did in the past) I wanted to preface it by reminding our parishioners and friends

how important Pledging and Stewardship is for us this year. One might think that since we are meeting at St. Mary's (rather like like living in a luxury apartment house with all bills paid) we might not NEED to have such a successful campaign this year. **NOTHING CAN BE FURTHER FROM THE TRUTH!** The Catholic Church and the Ordinariate Authorities are depending on us to maintain our commitment to St. Timothy's on a level which does not just match that of 2010 and 2011 but EXCEEDS it. We have been able to meet all of our salaries and bills this year (though we are behind on the pension/retirement payments for your priest since last December) but we do need to start a BUILDING FUND for our eventual move out of the nest into our own home. One of the (significant) determinations for the timing of this (when we can realistically make plans to look for our own church) will be our 2012 Stewardship Campaign. Dear parishioners and "Friends" of St. Timothy's, when the Parish Council conducts our 2012 Drive next month, please be generous!

- ❑ The Diocese of Fort Worth invites members of St. Timothy's Church to a farewell event on Sunday, November 25th, where we as a Diocese will give thanks for Bishop Kevin Vann's seven years as our Shepherd of Fort Worth, at a service of Vespers followed by a reception at Nolan Catholic High School, 4501 Bridge Street, Fort Worth, 6 p.m. Bishop Vann was immensely enthusiastic and supportive of our move from St. Timothy's Episcopal Church to becoming St. Timothy's Catholic Church, and we hope that as many as possible will attend this event.
- ❑ The 2012 annual conference of the Anglican Use Society will be held from Thursday, November 8 through Saturday, November 10. It will be hosted jointly by the parish of St. Therese of Lisieux and the diocese of Kansas City-St. Joseph. The Ordinary of the Ordinariate of the Chair of St. Peter, Msgr. Jeffrey N. Steenson, will take part in the conference. Most activities will be held at the Catholic Center at 20 West Ninth St. in Kansas City.
