**The Collect of the Day**

O God, whose blessed Son was manifested that he might destroy the works of the devil and make us children of God and heirs of eternal life: Grant us, we beseech thee, that, having this hope, we may purify ourselves even as he is pure; that, when he shall appear again with power and great glory, we may be made like unto him in his eternal and glorious kingdom; where with thee, O Father, and thee, O Holy Ghost, he liveth and reigneth ever, one God, world without end. *Response: Amen*

*The Lesson: Hebrews 9:24-28*

Christ has entered, not into a sanctuary made with hands, a copy of the true one, but into heaven itself, now to appear in the presence of God on our behalf. Nor was it to offer himself repeatedly, as the high priest enters the Holy Place yearly with blood not his own; for then he would have had to suffer repeatedly since the foundation of the world. But as it is, he has appeared once for all at the end of the age to put away sin by the sacrifice of himself. And just as it is appointed for men to die once, and after that comes judgment, so Christ, having been offered once to bear the sins of many, will appear a second time, not to deal with sin but to save those who are eagerly waiting for him.

NOTHING CAN BE FURTHER FROM THE TRUTH! The Catholic Church and the Ordinariate Authorities are depending on us to maintain our commitment to St. Timothy's on a level which does not just match that of 2010 and 2011 but EXCEEDS it. We have been able to meet all of our salaries and bills this year (though we are behind on the pension/retirement payments for your priest since last December) but we do need to start a BUILDING FUND for our eventual move out of the nest into our own home. One of the (significant) determinations for the timing of this (when we can realistically make plans to look for our own church) will be our 2012 Stewardship Campaign. Dear parishioners and "Friends" of St. Timothy's, when the Parish Council conducts our 2012 Drive next month, please be generous! \*("Friends" are those generous souls who, for geographic reasons, are unable to attend mass on Sundays, but want to support our apostolate and patrimony.)
