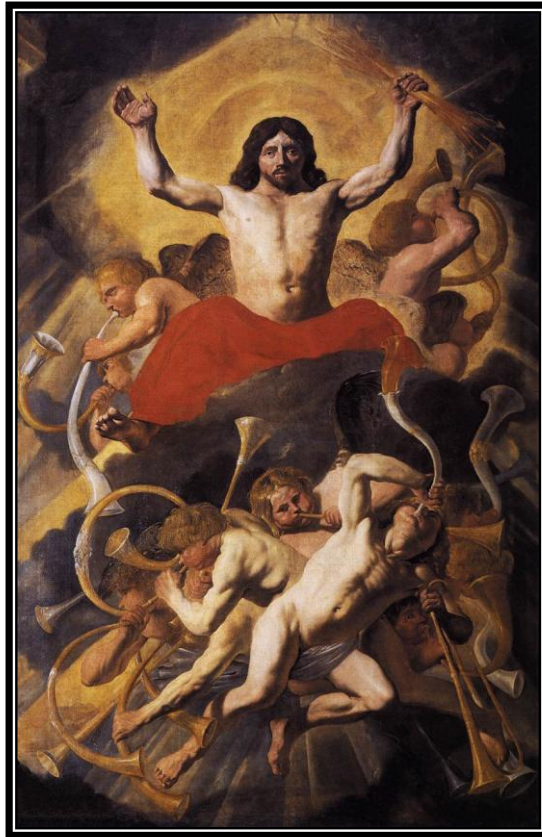

I have asked the Parish Council to organize our Stewardship Campaign this year (as our old Vestry did in the past) and we are going to enjoy a delicious barbeque Sunday NOVEMBER 25th after mass in the next few weeks as our "kick off". We hope ALL available parishioners will attend the barbeque and listen to our Stewardship Campaign that Sunday.

I wanted to preface our Campaign by reminding our parishioners and friends how important Pledging and Stewardship is for us -- especially this year.

One might think that since we are meeting at St. Mary's (rather like like living in a luxury apartment house with all bills paid) we might not NEED to have such a successful campaign this year. NOTHING CAN BE FURTHER FROM THE TRUTH! The Catholic Church and the Ordinariate Authorities are depending on us to maintain our commitment to St. Timothy's on a level which does not just match that of 2010 and 2011 but EXCEEDS it.

We have been able to meet all of our salaries and bills this year (though, truth be told, we have been unable to make the pension/retirement payments for your priest at all this year) Also, many parishioner have asked me about starting a BUILDING FUND for our eventual move out of the St. Mary's nest into our own home. The answer I give them is "Yes, we can: it all depends on YOU!" One of the (significant) determinations for the timing of any building fund (when we can begin realistically make plans to look for our own church) will be THIS 2012 Stewardship Campaign. Dear parishioners, and "Friends"* of St. Timothy's, when the Parish Council conducts our 2012 Drive on November 25th, please plan to attend the Kick Off barbeque and be generous!

*("Friends" are those generous souls who, for geographic reasons, are unable to attend mass on Sundays, but want to support our apostolate and patrimony)

STEWARDSHIP is not only about treasure, it is also about TIME -- Dear Parishioners in our greater DFW area: Please make every effort to attend Mass at St. Timothy's EVERY SUNDAY. Especially during this first year as a new Catholic Congregation hoping to obtain permission to begin a building fund, it is essential that we demonstrate our commitment to our congregation by our consistent attendance at mass each week. Just as we did when we were Episcopalians, as Catholics, we are required to submit our attendance records and our budget to those over us, who will use data like congregational giving, and Mass attendance to shape our future. Again, the ability to grow and have our own church depends on US!
