ANNOUNCEMENTS

- ❑ Happy Father's Day to all fathers at Mass today. May St. Joseph, the foster father of the Christ Jesus and Patron of Fathers, guard and guide each of you this year.
- ❑ Congratulations to Ella Morales who was confirmed this morning. - a momentous day for her.
- ❑ Most of you are aware that the Catholic Church is a vestry-free entity. However, there is a Parish Council which is very similar. The terminology is a bit different in that the senior warden is called the president and the junior warden is called the vice president. Our first Parish Council meeting will be next Sunday, June 24th, following mass. All past 'vestry' members are now members of the St. Timothy's Parish Council and are encouraged to attend.
- ❑ Our organist, Tomi Godbee, has made the suggestion that each parishioner purchase a hymnal and bring it with them each week for use during mass. We have nowhere to store them here at St. Mary's. Hymnals are available for less than \$20 and Tomi has offered to order them. The ultimate plan is to eliminate the cost of printing music each week. We must continue printing the bulletins each week and parishioners are encouraged to help with that expense. Please give us your thoughts.
- ❑ Very historically important ordinations for the diocese, the Church in the United States and the Universal Church will be occurring this month. Saturday morning, June 30th, at 9:00 AM at St. Elizabeth Ann Seton in Keller, the following deacons will be ordained priests for the Ordinariate of the Chair of St. Peter: Christopher Stainbrook, Charles Hough III, Charles Hough IV, Timothy Perkins, Joshua Whitfield, and Mark Cannaday. Msgr. Jeffrey Steenson, the Ordinary, will be present at this event, and will be calling these candidates to Orders shortly.
- ❑ Now that our formation classes have ended, it's time to think about returning to our traditional "Coffee/fellowship" hour after mass. Coffee/Fellowship time after our Mass is a particular tradition which we bring to the Catholic Church. Often, regular Roman Catholics just evaporate after their masses, but we hope that fellowship time will be part of our "patrimony" which we continue. To do this, though, we need the help of everybody, not just a few families. If you would like to continue to have Coffee Hour/Fellowship time on Sundays, (and are willing to participate by

periodically bringing and serving refreshments --which need not be coffee and pasties every week -- and especially by cleaning up!) please see Parish Council President Ken Gill or Hospitality Chairman Mike Langston.

- ❑ The Catholic Bishops of the United States have declared a Fortnight for Freedom, asking Catholics to engage in a “great hymn of prayer for our country” and a “national campaign of teaching and witness for religious liberty”. Our Bishops have asked us to look to the great saints of Catholic history whose courage we can emulate. The fortnight begins on June 21, the vigil of the Feast of Saints John Fisher and Thomas More, who, like John the Baptist, were beheaded by a king (Henry VIII) who desired them not to speak the truth about the Church and the sacred bond of marriage. During this coming week we celebrate the Feast of Saints Peter and Paul, who likewise were martyred by the Roman emperor for their preaching of Jesus Christ. And the fortnight concludes on July 4th, the day when we celebrate our American liberty. Please keep this Vigil in your prayers.
- ❑ Concerning Pledging and Donations, please remember that even when you take a vacation, our bills don't! In fact, unlike the rest of us, they NEVER take one, and are with us each month, year in and year out! This year, with NO cash reserves AT ALL (since we had to give our entire checking account balance, as well as all monies from the building fund - almost \$30,000 - to the ACNA Diocese when we left our old campus in January, and therefore came penniless to St. Mary's) we urge all of our parishioners to keep current with their pledges during these lazy (hot) and hazy days of summer!
