- ❑ Our first Parish Council meeting will be today in the rectory Conference room following mass. All past 'vestry' members are now members of the St. Timothy's Parish Council and are encouraged to attend.
- ❑ Now that our formation classes have ended, we have returned to our traditional "Coffee/fellowship" hour after mass. Coffee/Fellowship time after our Mass is a particular tradition which we bring to the Catholic Church. Often, regular Roman Catholics just evaporate after their masses, but we hope that fellowship time will be part of our "patrimony" which we continue. To do this, though, we need the help of everybody, not just a few families. Each week will be Potluck and everyone can bring something to share. We will also put away the tables and chairs before we leave as well as clean up what we mess up. It is no longer necessary to mop the entire floor each week. Please join us for a fun time.
- ❑ Very historically important ordinations for the diocese, the Church in the United States and the Universal Church will be occurring this month. This Saturday morning, June 30<sup>th</sup>, at 9:00 AM at St. Elizabeth Ann Seton in Keller, the following deacons will be ordained priests for the Ordinariate of the Chair of St. Peter: Christopher Stainbrook, Charles Hough III, Charles Hough IV, Timothy Perkins, Joshua Whitfield, and Mark Cannaday. Msgr. Jeffrey Steenson, the Ordinary, will be present at this event, and will be calling these candidates to Orders shortly.
- ❑ Next Sunday, July 1<sup>st</sup>, we will have a parish dinner following mass to celebrate Fr. Stainbrook's ordination as a priest in the Catholic Church. We will go to Vance Godbey's on Jacksboro Highway that typically closes at 4pm on Sunday; however they have agreed to stay open later for us. We **DO** need a count of people who will be attending, so please see Marshelle Langston **TODAY**.
- ❑ Our organist, Tomi Godbee, has made the suggestion that each parishioner purchase a hymnal and bring it with them each week for use during mass. We have nowhere to store them here at St. Mary's. Hymnals are available for less than \$20 and Tomi has offered to order them. The ultimate plan is to eliminate the cost of printing music each week. We must continue printing the bulletins each week and parishioners are encouraged to help with that expense. Please give us your thoughts.

- ❑ The Catholic Church Women will have a salad lunch on the last Sunday in July. Lola Hankins will be selling raffle/50-50 tickets after mass today.
- ❑ The Catholic Bishops of the United States have declared a Fortnight for Freedom, asking Catholics to engage in a “great hymn of prayer for our country” and a “national campaign of teaching and witness for religious liberty”. Our Bishops have asked us to look to the great saints of Catholic history whose courage we can emulate. The fortnight begins on June 21, the vigil of the Feast of Saints John Fisher and Thomas More, who, like John the Baptist, were beheaded by a king (Henry VIII) who desired them not to speak the truth about the Church and the sacred bond of marriage. During this coming week we celebrate the Feast of Saints Peter and Paul, who likewise were martyred by the Roman emperor for their preaching of Jesus Christ. And the fortnight concludes on July 4<sup>th</sup>, the day when we celebrate our American liberty. Please keep this Vigil in your prayers.
