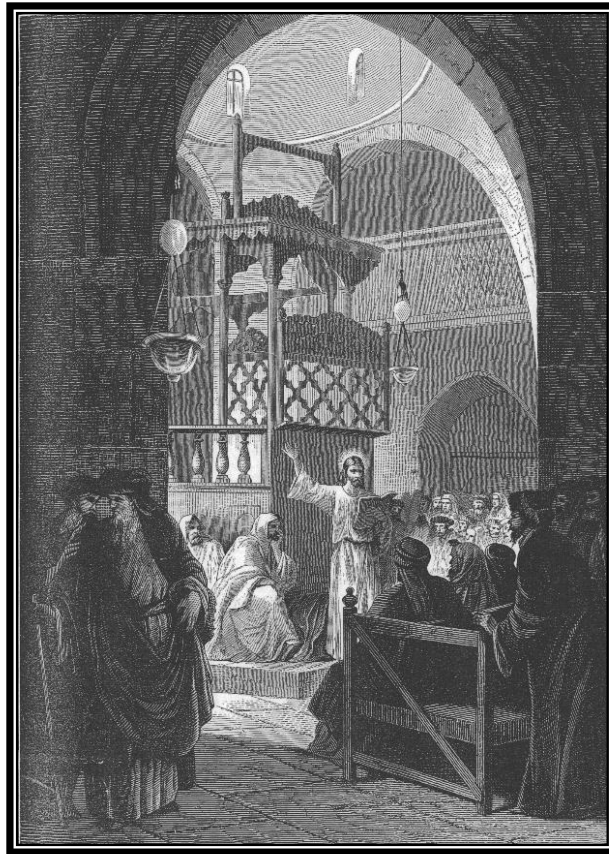

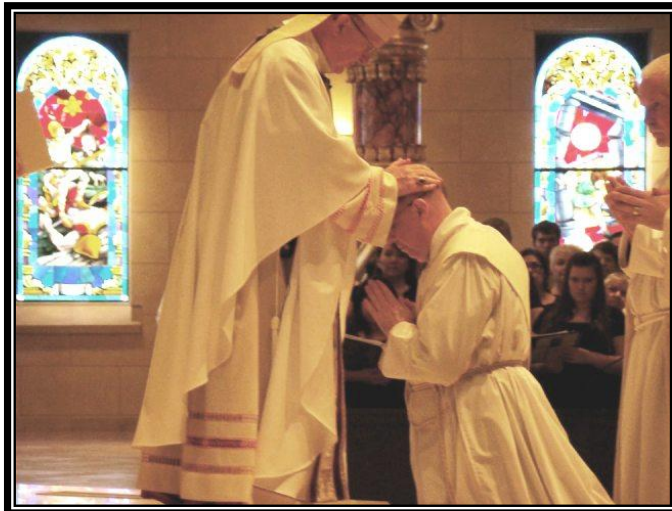

- ❑ Thank you to all who attended the priestly ordinations last Saturday -- it was a beautiful and moving ceremony and our St. Timothy's was well represented.... now, it's FORWARD for St. Timothy's!
- ❑ St. Timothy's is now able to offer a full Catholic Mass (This means that ANY of one's friends who are Roman Catholic are able to attend our Mass and allowed to receive Holy Communion. Our Mass as Catholics is very similar to the old St Timothy's Anglican Mass, but with a few additions which are noted in the Sunday bulletins. Note especially that instead of using the Communion Prayer written by Anglican Archbishop of Canterbury, Thomas Cranmer, we will be using the historic Roman Canon at the Liturgy of the Eucharist. The Roman Canon dates back to the 16th century Council of Trent, is beloved throughout the Church, and is used in traditional Catholic Churches (including Ordinariate Churches) around the world. Note also the guidelines for Communion (who is permitted to receive Communion at St. Timothy's) decreed by the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops. Copies of these guidelines are available in the narthex of the church.
- ❑ Our traditional "Coffee/fellowship" hour has been renamed "Tea Time" It will resume today in the Parish Hall Cafeteria. Iced Tea, Fruit Punch and afternoon snacks are available for our parishioners and guests during Tea Time. We hope that many people will sign up to act as hosts and clean up coordinators. This social time time after our Mass is a particular tradition which we bring to the Catholic Church. Often, regular Roman Catholics just evaporate after their masses, but we hope that fellowship time will be part of our "patrimony" which we continue. To do this, though, we need the help of everybody, not just a few families. Please join us for a fun time, enjoy tea or iced tea or snacks -- and help preserve our fellowship!!
