## *Pentecost*


*1st Reading: Acts 2:1-11*

When the day of Pentecost had come, they were all together in one place. And suddenly a sound came from heaven like the rush of a mighty wind, and it filled all the house where they were sitting. And there appeared to them tongues as of fire, distributed and resting on each one of them. And they were all filled with the Holy Spirit and began to speak in other tongues, as the Spirit gave them utterance. Now there were dwelling in Jerusalem Jews, devout men from every nation under heaven. And at this sound the multitude came together, and they were bewildered, because each one heard them speaking in his own language. And they were amazed and wondered, saying, "Are not all these who are speaking Galileans? And how is it that we hear, each of us in his own native language? Parthians and Medes and Elamites and residents of Mesopotamia, Judea and Cappadocia, Pontus and Asia, Phrygia and Pamphylia, Egypt and the parts of Libya belonging to Cyrene, and visitors from Rome, both Jews and proselytes, Cretans and Arabians, we hear them telling in our own tongues the mighty works of God."

Therefore I want you to understand that no one speaking by the Spirit of God ever says "Jesus be cursed!" and no one can say "Jesus is Lord" except by the Holy Spirit. Now there are varieties of gifts, but the same Spirit; and there are varieties of service, but the same Lord; and there are varieties of working, but it is the same God who inspires them all in every one. To each is given the manifestation of the Spirit for the common good. For just as the body is one and has many members, and all the members of the body, though many, are one body, so it is with Christ. For by one Spirit we were all baptized into one body--Jews or Greeks, slaves or free--and all were made to drink of one Spirit. *Response: Thanks be to God.*

*The Gospel: John 20:19-23*

On the evening of that day, the first day of the week, the doors being shut where the disciples were, for fear of the Jews, Jesus came and stood among them and said to them, "Peace be with you." When he had said this, he showed them his hands and his side. Then the disciples were glad when they saw the Lord. Jesus said to them again, "Peace be with you. As the Father has sent me, even so I send you." And when he had said this, he breathed on them, and said to them, "Receive the Holy Spirit. If you forgive the sins of any, they are forgiven; if you retain the sins of any, they are retained." *Praise be to Thee O Christ.*

- ◇ Severe floods have hit Croatia, Serbia and the Balkins this week, affecting friends close to home. Several villages have declared emergency situations following floods across Croatia. The Mura, Sava, Sutla, Kupa and Lonja rivers have all flooded with Sava, which runs through Zagreb, rising to 15 feet near the capital, the highest it has been in the last 50 years. What does this mean for us at St. Timothy's? The hardworking custodian at our host parish of St. Mary's, Zoran Radon, (whom many of our people have met) has told us that his father's home (the home where he grew up) has been completely destroyed by the floods. Croatia does not offer Flood Insurance, so the Radon family (along with thousands of others) have lost everything. St. Mary's is taking up a special collection this Sunday and next week to help the people of Zoran's village. St. Timothy's parishioners are invited to participate in this assistance. Last week our generous parishioners donated \$85 to Croatian relief -- the Radon family, and the Parish of St. Mary's Thanks you very much. To contribute, one can put a check made out to "St. Mary of the Assumption" in the collection basket (please write "Flood Assistance" or "Zoran" in the memo section of the check), or one can bring a contribution to the business office at the church during the week. The money will be sent to the local parish church for distribution to those in need. Thank you and God bless you!
