Organ Postlude Tomi Godbee

Last month, Fr Stainbrook attended the first Clergy Retreat of the Personal Ordinariate of the Chair of St Peter. The retreat was led by Monsignor Steven Lopes of the Congregation for the Doctrine of the Faith (CDF) in Rome. An American, Msgr. Lopes is responsible for all CDF business in the English-speaking world. This includes all matters related to the three Ordinariates (North America, The United Kingdom and Australia) established for former Anglicans under the apostolic constitution *Anglicanorum coetibus*. He is thus perhaps the single most well-informed person in the Vatican regarding the Ordinariates. One of his duties has been to serve as Secretary to the Liturgical Commission established by Rome to oversee the revision of the Book of Divine Worship (BDW) containing the liturgical texts authorized for use by the Ordinariates.

This Commission has now completed work on a new Order of Mass, which was introduced to us during the retreat (one of the main purposes of the retreat was to unveil this new Order of mass). It will be implemented throughout all congregations within the Ordinariate as of the First Sunday of Advent. While there is much discussion about what exactly constitutes the Anglican “patrimony” that the Ordinariates intended to preserve

within the Catholic Church, there is general agreement that the liturgy is a certainly major component of it.

Last Friday, Fr. Stainbrook provided a full explanation of the new Order of Mass by email. For those of you who do not have computers or didn't get the email, a printed copy is available from the ushers.

As a reminder, St. Timothy's is a fully Roman Catholic Congregation, and that receiving communion at this mass satisfies the obligation for all Catholics. Please refer to the "Guidelines for receiving Holy Communion" on page 31 of the mass booklet.
