


5th Sunday after Trinity

1st Reading: Wisdom of Solomon 12:13, 16-19

For neither is there any god besides thee, whose care is for all men, to whom thou shouldst prove that thou hast not judged unjustly; For thy strength is the source of righteousness, and thy sovereignty over all causes thee to spare all. For thou dost show thy strength when men doubt the completeness of thy power, and dost rebuke any insolence among those who know it. Thou who art sovereign in strength dost judge with mildness, and with great forbearance thou dost govern us; for thou hast power to act whenever thou dost choose. Through such works thou has taught thy people that the righteous man must be kind, and thou hast filled thy sons with good hope, because thou givest repentance for sins. *Response: Thanks be to God.*

The Epistle: Romans 8: 8:26-27

Likewise the Spirit helps us in our weakness; for we do not know how to pray as we ought, but the Spirit himself intercedes for us with sighs too deep for words. And he who searches the hearts of men knows what is the mind of the Spirit, because the Spirit intercedes for the saints according to the will of God. *Response: Thanks be to God.*

The Gospel: Matthew 13:24-43

Another parable he put before them, saying, "The kingdom of heaven may be compared to a man who sowed good seed in his field; but while men were sleeping, his enemy came and sowed weeds among the wheat, and went away. So when the plants came up and bore grain, then the weeds appeared also. And the servants of the householder came and said to him, 'Sir, did you not sow good seed in your field? How then has it weeds?' He said to them, 'An enemy has done this.' The servants said to him, 'Then do you want us to go and gather them?' But he said, 'No; lest in gathering the weeds you root up the wheat along with them. Let both grow together until the harvest; and at harvest time I will tell the reapers, Gather the weeds first and bind them in bundles to be burned, but gather the wheat into my barn.'" Another parable he put before them, saying, "The kingdom of heaven is like a grain of mustard seed which a man took and sowed in his field; it is the smallest of all seeds, but when it has grown it is the greatest of shrubs and becomes a tree, so that the birds of the air come and make nests in its branches." He told them another parable. "The kingdom of heaven is like leaven which a woman took and hid in three measures of flour, till it was all leavened." All this Jesus said to the crowds in parables; indeed he said nothing to them without a parable. This was to fulfil what was spoken by the prophet: "I will open my mouth in parables, I will utter what has been hidden since the foundation of the world." Then he left the crowds and went into the house. And his disciples came to him, saying, "Explain to us the parable of the weeds of the field." He answered, "He who sows the good seed is the Son of man; the field is the world, and the good seed means the sons of the kingdom; the weeds are the sons of the evil one, and the enemy who sowed them is the devil; the harvest is the close of the age, and the reapers are angels. Just as the weeds are gathered and burned with fire, so will it be at the close of the age. The Son of man will send his angels, and they will gather out of his kingdom all causes of sin and all evildoers, and throw them into the furnace of fire; there men will weep and gnash their teeth. Then the righteous will shine like the sun in the kingdom of their Father. He who has ears, let him hear.

For most years, July is a quiet month in the church -- people take their vacation, and there are few meetings or events of major importance or impact scheduled. This is not so for the summer of 2014.

Bishop Olson has written a letter for the Diocese of Fort Worth about the crisis at our border regarding the influx unaccompanied immigrant minors, which we commend to all parishioners. Please search your hearts and see how you can respond to His Excellency's letter. A copy of the letter is available from the ushers.

Also, in a move which will profoundly impact the Church (both Catholic and Protestant) throughout the world, the General Synod of the Church of England has voted to approve women bishops for the Anglican Church in England. This is a major blow to our many Anglo Catholic friends in the Church of England (and elsewhere, as what happens in England impacts Anglicans around the world) and we hold them in our prayers at this time.

As reported in another English newspaper. The Catholic Herald, the English Ordinariate (Personal Ordinariate of Our Lady of Walsingham) is planning an Exploration Day "Called To Be One" in the fall for Anglo Catholics who are now wondering about their future (as this action of the General Synod will irrefutably and irrevocably change the very nature of ministers in the "Mother Church" of Anglicanism) and wanting to learn more about the Ordinariate option -- and it may well be that our Personal Ordinariate of the Chair of St. Peter may plan one (or more) of these "Exploration Days" as well. If so, we expect St. Timothy's, as one of the first Congregations to become Roman Catholic as a congregation, via the Ordinariate, to take a leading role, to share our story, and to welcome others into the Catholic Church -- we will know more soon from the Chancery in Houston, and we hope that all of our parishioners will be eager to assist in sharing our story about our journey together.

In the meantime, we continue as we always have, worshiping God at Mass, and enjoying each others fellowship throughout these "lazy hazy days of summer" and beyond, and, as always, thankful to God for His many blessings to our congregation.
