


10th Sunday after Trinity



Bishop Olson, at the request of the Holy Father, is asking all parishes to include in the following special intention for persecuted Christians in Iraq in the Prayer of the Faithful this weekend. The request has been forwarded to the United States by His Excellency Most Reverend Carlo Maria Viganò, Apostolic Nuncio to the United States, through Bishop Joseph E Kurtz, President of the U.S. Conference of Bishops because of the urgent dangers that Christian face in the conflict-torn Iraq.

Catholic Diocese of Fort Worth on ALS Association Bucket Challenge

The ALS Association Ice Bucket challenge is a rage. But some Diocese of Fort Worth Catholics have raised questions about participating in the challenge because some of the funds raised will be used by ALS to fund research done with embryonic stem cells.

Bishop Michael Olson observes that embryonic stem cell research goes against Catholic moral teaching about the sanctity of life from the moment of conception until natural death.

Many Catholics, as well as others, in the Diocese's geographic area suffer from ALS. Research to find a cure for the disease is important to those who are afflicted.

Therefore, Bishop Olson urges Catholics who participate in the Bucket Challenge to direct their financial contributions to an organization which conducts research in a manner consistent with Catholic teachings: The John Paul II Medical Research Institute.

The John Paul II Medical Research Institute (JP2MRI), located in Iowa City, IA, "focuses on the most ethical and cost-effective way of conducting medical research to help develop therapies and cures for a variety of diseases." Bishop Olson asks every Catholic in the Diocese to pray for those afflicted with ALS and for their families who are providing such loving care.

Pastors are asked to announce to their congregations that if parishioners choose to participate in the ALC Bucket Challenge, they are requested to designate their donation to the John Paul II Medical Research Institute, or some other research effort that conforms to Catholic moral teaching.
