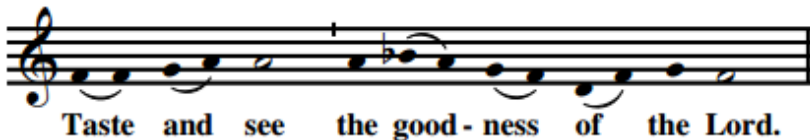
Twelfth Sunday after Trinity ~ Year B

1st Reading: Joshua 24:1-2A, 15-17, 18B Then Joshua gathered all the tribes of Israel to Shechem, and summoned the elders, the heads, the judges, and the officers of Israel; and they presented themselves before God. And Joshua said to all the people, “Thus says the Lord, the God of Israel, ‘Your fathers lived of old beyond the Euphra’tes, Terah, the father of Abraham and of Nahor. And if you be unwilling to serve the Lord, choose this day whom you will serve, whether the gods your fathers served in the region beyond the River, or the gods of the Amorites in whose land you dwell; but as for me and my house, we will serve the Lord.’” Then the people answered, “Far be it from us that we should forsake the Lord, to serve other gods; for it is the Lord our God who brought us and our fathers up from the land of Egypt, out of the house of bondage, and who did those great signs in our sight, and preserved us in all the way that we went, and among all the peoples through whom we passed; therefore we also will serve the Lord, for he is our God.”

The Epistle: Ephesians 5:21-32 Be subject to one another out of reverence for Christ. Wives, be subject to your husbands, as to the Lord. For the husband is the head of the wife as Christ is the head of the church, his body, and is himself its Savior. As the church is subject to Christ, so let wives also be subject in everything to their husbands. Husbands, love your wives, as Christ loved the church and gave himself up for her, that he might sanctify her, having cleansed her by the washing of water with the word, that he might present the church to himself in splendor, without spot or wrinkle or any such thing, that she might be holy and without blemish. Even so husbands should love their wives as their own bodies. He who loves his wife loves himself. For no man ever hates his own flesh, but nourishes and cherishes it, as Christ does the church, because we are members of his body. "For this reason a man shall leave his father and mother and be joined to his wife, and the two shall become one flesh." This is a great mystery, and I mean in reference to Christ and the church.

The Gospel: John 6:60-69 Many of his disciples, when they heard it, said, "This is a hard saying; who can listen to it?" But Jesus, knowing in himself that his disciples murmured at it, said to them, "Do you take offense at this? Then what if you were to see the Son of man ascending where he was before? It is the spirit that gives life, the flesh is of no avail; the words that I have spoken to you are spirit and life. But there are some of you that do not believe." For Jesus knew from the first who those were that did not believe, and who it was that should betray him. And he said, "This is why I told you that no one can come to me unless it is granted him by the Father." After this many of his disciples drew back and no longer went about with him. Jesus said to the twelve, "Will you also go away?" Simon Peter answered him, "Lord, to whom shall we go? You have

the words of eternal life; and we have believed, and have come to know, that you are the Holy One of God.” *Response: Praise be to Thee O Christ*

- "This is the day that the Lord has Made: Come Let us Rejoice and be Glad in It." - ❑ Former Episcopal Priest, Louis Tobola, was an important member of the Episcopal Diocese of Fort Worth for many years. He built two magnificent edifices for the Episcopalians (St. Vincent's Cathedral in Bedford, where Father Stainbrook was his assistant for three years in the 1990's, and St. Barnabas in Keller) Since the erection of the Ordinariate (and indeed, for half a decade previously) Louis had been praying about entering the Catholic Church. He was one of the priests (along with Fathers Hough, Stainbrook, Perkins and others) who met with Bishop Vann in 2008, and he helped write the "position paper" on Anglicans entering the Catholic Church which was sent to the Vatican by a group of Episcopal clerics from Fort Worth. Last Saturday, August 15th, it was Father Stainbrook's honor (acting under the authority of the Personal Ordinariate of the Chair of St. Peter) to Confirm Louis, and Jane Ladik, one of his former parishioners into the One, Holy, Roman, Catholic and Apostolic Church-- Welcome Home Louis and Jane!
