
Twenty Fourth Sunday after Trinity ~ Year B

And then they will see the Son of man coming in clouds with great power and glory. And then he will send out the angels, and gather his elect from the four winds, from the ends of the earth to the ends of heaven. “From the fig tree learn its lesson: as soon as its branch becomes tender and puts forth its leaves, you know that summer is near. So also, when you see these things taking place, you know that he is near, at the very gates. Truly, I say to you, this generation will not pass away before all these things take place. Heaven and earth will pass away, but my words will not pass away. “But of that day or that hour no one knows, not even the angels in heaven, nor the Son, but only the Father. *Response: Praise be to Thee O Christ*



On Advent 1, November 29, all Ordinariate churches all over the world will begin using the new Missals. *Will this change our mass? NO!* The Mass will remain as it has since we became Catholic in 2012; however, at the direction of the Chancery, this will eliminate our pew booklets. With the publication of the Divine Worship Missal, the Ordinariates' form of the one, holy Mass will be copyrighted. Therefore, we will no longer be permitted to publish every word that is spoken or sung during our worship. Those of you who regularly attend Solemn Mass at St. Timothy's know that heretofore we have made participation in the liturgy very "user-friendly" by including in our Mass booklet almost everything that's said at Mass. What will be published starting Advent 1 will be a modified version of the service leaflet/bulletin we currently use. The prayers that the celebrant offers by himself on behalf of the worshipers will not be printed. There is at the moment no Peoples Missal/prayer book available for us to offer Divine
